 - On-premises public entertainment venues (excluding theatre or cinema).
- New Extended Trading Authorisations (ETA) for:
 - Hotels
 - Clubs
 - Small bars (see note below)
 - Packaged Liquor Licences (bottle shop and online)
 - On-premises (all classes)
 - Producer/Wholesalers with Drink on Premises Authorisation.
- Other applications for:
 - Increase licensed boundaries by more than 50%
 - Multi occasion Extended Trading Authorisation (MOETA)
 - Primary Service Authorisation for an On-premises
 - any application (or class of application) that is required by the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority to be accompanied by a SoRPE.

What you need to know

You need to complete your SoRPE and lodge it with your application. An application will not be accepted if it is required to be accompanied by an SoRPE and it is not provided.

The application and SoRPE will be posted on the L&GNSW application noticeboard for at least 30 days. The community and other stakeholders will have 30 days to view it and make submissions

Note:

- You must be careful preparing your SoRPE. You may need professional advice for more complex or contentious applications.
- If information is missing, we'll need to ask you to supply that information to support the application. This may delay the application process, or you may have to resubmit your SoRPE.
- If your SoRPE is incomplete or unsatisfactory, the 30-day noticeboard period may restart.
- Applications for either a new small bar or a small bar ETA, which will result in trading up to 2:00am, are not required to be accompanied by a SoRPE if:
 - development consent (or an amendment to the development consent) is required from local council to use the premises as a small bar or to sell liquor during the times sought in the application, and
 - police and L&GNSW have been provided with notification of the development application within two working days of it being lodged with council, and
- A SoRPE is required if you wish to extend your small bar trading hours between 2:00am and 5:00am.
